

HOLE #	PAR	DESCRIPTION
LAKE # 1	4	A slight dog leg right with a fairway bunker on the right side. The second shot is back uphill and will play longer than it looks. Make sure you stay below and to the left of the pin.
LAKE # 2	4	A strong dog left with a fairway bunker straight through the fairway. The fairway has many uneven lies and works uphill to the green. The green is guarded by a deep bunker on the left and mounds on the right.
LAKE # 3	5	Generous driving area. Stay to the right of the bunkers and the hazard off the tee. The green sits up high, has a false front and a bunker on the left. Its reachable with two long shots.
LAKE # 4	4	Straight away and uphill. Big area to hit your drive. A large green with bunkers on the left and right. The second shot plays long because of the uphill.
LAKE # 5	4	Straight away hole that goes downhill then back up. The teeing area tapers in the left and a big tree stands in your way if you miss your drive left. The green is very shallow and has bunkers all around it.
LAKE # 6	3	Medium length hole with water in front. The steep bank will send a shot short to a watery grave and long shot will find the back bunker. Distance control is difficult with all the tall pines around the green.
LAKE # 7	5	Slight dog leg left with out of bounds on the left and right side of the hole. Fairway bunkers guard the left side. A very shallow green with a deep front bunker makes it difficult for the ball to stop on the putting surface.
<u>LAKE # 8</u>	3	Signature hole. Straight downhill to a green guarded by water in front and to the left. A bunker protects the right side. The hole will play a club or two short because of the change in elevation.
LAKE # 9	4	Straight away with a small creek running down the far right side. The green tilts from back to front with bunkers on both sides. Make sure you stay below the pin on your approach to the green.
LAKE # 10	4	Straight uphill with a wide area to hit your drive. Favor the left side and take an extra club for the uphill second shot. Green slopes from back to front.
LAKE # 11	4	Narrow driving area that works downhill. There is a small pond on the right only reachable by the longest hitters. The largest green is guarded by bunkers on the right and front. Check yardage and take the right club based on pin position.
<u>LAKE # 12</u>	4	Dog leg left with out of bounds down the left and right side. Fairway bunkers are set on both sides of the fairway. A small pond in front of the green makes for a long carry to a green that has a bunker to the right.
LAKE # 13	3	Long shot with all carry to a large green. The green is 3/4 of the way surrounded by water. Bunkers right and front also protect the hole.

<u>LAKE # 14</u>	5	Slight dog leg left with Lake Trace all the way down the left side. Second shot is back across a small canal with a fairway bunker on the right. A large green can handle long fairway shots as well as a short pitch. Reachable in two by the long hitters.
LAKE # 15	3	Short uphill hole to a blind green. The bunker in front right sits more away then it looks. Deep bunker on the front left and back make it very difficult to find the putting surface.
LAKE # 16	4	Slight dog leg left with fairway bunkers on the right and left. The trees and another bunker guard the left hand side. The green slopes from back to front and will be quick from above the pin.
LAKE # 17	4	Straight away with out of bounds on the left. A very slim green works away from the second shot. Bunkers have the whole green surrounded.
LAKE # 18	5	Elevated tee to a large landing area. Lake Trace come in and follows the hole down the right side. The second shot is back across a small canal. Bunkers are placed on the left side of the fairway and front and back of green.

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CREEK # 1	4	A slight dog leg left with out of bounds on the right side. The second shot is back uphill and will play longer then it looks. Make sure you stay below and to the left of the pin.
CREEK # 2	4	A straight away drive with a fairway bunker on the left. The fairway works uphill to the green. The green is guarded by bunkers on the left and right.
<u>CREEK # 3</u>	5	Tight driving area. Stay to the right of the bunkers and left of the hazard off the tee. The second shot will be a layup short of a small canal that flows into Lake Trace. A bunker and water on the left protect a very small green. Its reachable with two long shots.
CREEK # 4	3	Medium length shot to a very small green well guarded by deep bunkers and water. The tee box will point you to the right of the green so take extra care with your set up.
CREEK # 5	4	Players will drive straight out and then the hole work tight and up a big hill. A small creek runs in front of your second shot and bunkers guard the green from the right. Second shot plays long and uphill, so take enough club.
CREEK # 6	4	Dog leg right that works downhill around the corner. Out of bounds and trees are down the right side. A fairway bunker guides the player to the center of the fairway. Shallow green with bunkers front left and back right.
CREEK # 7	3	Medium length downhill shot. Only trouble is the deep bunker right and steep drop off over the green.
CREEK # 8	5	Straight narrow hole with a creek down the right and out of bounds

		on the left. Players hit back across the small creek as they approach green which is guarded by a bunker right and water left.
CREEK # 9	4	Straight downhill and plenty of area to hit your drive. The green tilts from back to front with bunkers on both sides. Make sure you stay below the pin on your approach to the green.
CREEK # 10	3	All carry because of a small creek in front of the green. Bunkers sit in front right and left.
CREEK # 11	5	Narrow driving area with out of bounds right and a creek down the left. The long green is guarded by a bunker on the left. Two big shots will make it to the green.
CREEK # 12	4	Dog leg right and uphill with out of bounds down the left side. A fairway bunker on right side of the fairway leads you to an uphill second shot that plays long. A big green that is protected by bunkers left front and back.
CREEK # 13	4	Straight away downhill with bunkers and out of bound left off the tee. A shallow green sits up while a deep bunker waits in front. Second shots play true yardage even though its downhill.
CREEK # 14	4	Slight dog leg right with woods all down right side. Second shot is to the smallest green on both courses. A large bunker will catch any shot short and right.
CREEK # 15	5	A dog leg right with a large landing area to hit your drive. Players should favor the right side on your second shot for a more favorable approach shot to the green. A deep bunker right and shallow bunker left protect the green.
<u>CREEK # 16</u>	3	Short hole but the player must carry the shot to the green. A small pond works back in front of the hole. A deep bunker will catch any shot just short.
CREEK # 17	4	Straight away with out of bounds on the left. A fairway bunker frame the hole from the right. The green work away from the second shot. A bunker in the front forces the player to take plenty club.
<u>CREEK # 18</u>	5	Dog leg right with Lake Trace on the left and down the entire side of the hole. The second shot is to a green that is surrounded by water left and right. Bunkers are placed on the right side and back of green.
